Ransom Payments and Interest

Crisis Management and Support Services

Your policy may also cover the cost of hiring additional services or consultants to assist with the ransom and negotiation process. The policy also provides you with those services directly: some providers offer their own crisis management consultants and negotiators who may be used in a kidnapping situation.

Public Relations

Many kidnapping situations can attract media attention and public scrutiny, which can impose additional costs and stress on your company. Your policy may cover the public relations costs that your company might incur in the aftermath of a kidnapping.

Lawsuits
