What Does Auto Insurance Cover?



Liability

Liability coverage pays for expenses due to an accident you are at fault for. It usually includes bodily injury or property damage liability.



Personal Injury Protection (PIP)

PIP pays for medical expenses sustained from a crash for the policyholder and their passengers — even if you were at fault. Depending on your state requirements, policies may cover lost wages due to injuries, child care, funeral costs, and/or a small death benefit that arise from the accident.



Uninsured Motorists

Despite insurance being legally required of most drivers, accidents happen every day involving uninsured or underinsured drivers. In these situations, your own policy will cover the costs, paying out after the accident even if the other driver was at fault. Most Auto Insurance policies will cover both property damage and bodily injury that result from an accident caused by an uninsured driver.



Collision and Comprehensive Coverage

Some Auto Insurance policies will pay to fix your car or reimburse you for damage done to your car or its value. Collision Insurance typically covers damage to your car resulting from an accident, while comprehensive coverages will cover damages resulting from thefts, natural disasters, vandalism, and more.
